A **Humanist Celebrant** is the equivalent of clergy in a religion like a pastor, priest, minister, imam, rabbi, or pandit, but we do **not** consider ourselves a religion in the traditional, god-centered sense. Many secular people get married and have children, but who would cater for their ceremonies or advice on secular issues, in general? Our service is based on the <u>humanist philosophy</u> that we provide for our community and the like-minded. In the USA, I am legally authorized to perform marriages, but in Trinidad & Tobago, I can only conduct the ceremony.

I am certified by the American Humanist Association's *Humanist Society* (see certificate on the next page) to perform the following:

Ceremonial – Life-cycle celebrations, commemorations, and ceremonies

- 1. Weddings (Same-sex and Opposite sex)
- 2. Baby Naming/Welcoming Ceremonies
- 3. Funerals
- 4. Rites of Passage (puberty)
- 5. Renewal of Marriage Vows
- 6. Divorce Ceremonies (parting on good terms children security)
- 7. <u>Croning</u> (a celebration/ceremony to honor wise older women)
- 8. Invocations in Public Settings
- 9. Other related ceremonies in demand/requested

Pastoral – Individual and special group care through counseling or education

- 1. Counseling individuals in relation to Humanist issues
- 2. Advice on personal development/life decisions
- 3. Advice/workshops on ethics
- 4. Advice/workshops on secular parenting
- 5. Other related areas
